

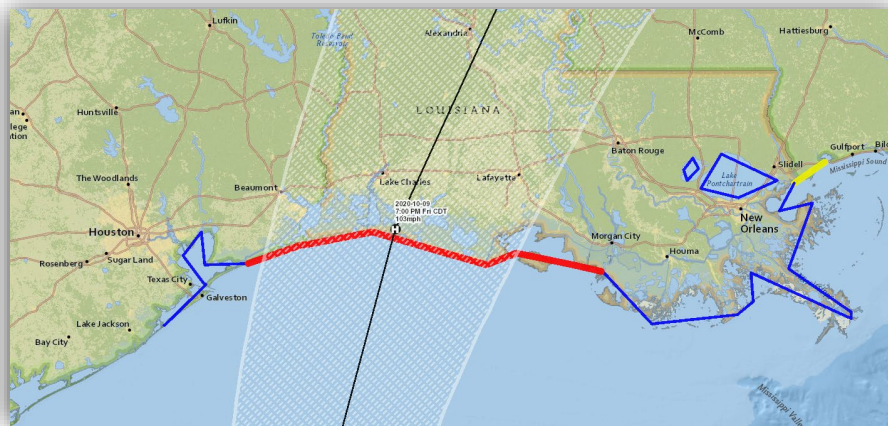

Hurricane Delta (CAT 2) - 2020

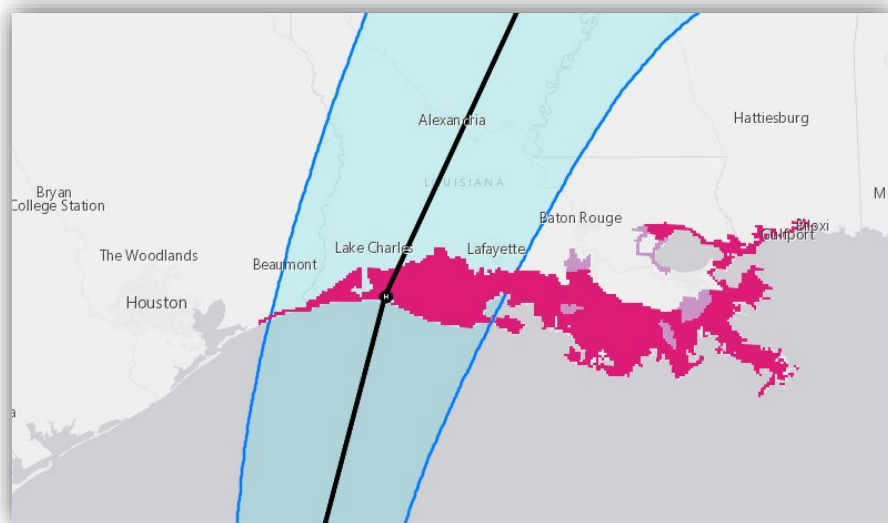

Current Projected Path & Landfall:

Path:	NW across the western Gulf of Mexico; projections call for the path to curve to the NE; present forward motion NW at 13 mph	Landfall:	Central Louisiana Coastline, LA (Currently projected landfall is marginally east of where Hurricane Laura made landfall on August 27, 2020)
Time & Date:	Fri, Oct 10, 2020 7:00 PM (CDT)	Strength:	CAT 2 Hurricane (96 mph – 110 mph)
Trend:	<p>Having crossed the northern tip of the Yucatan Peninsula, Hurricane Delta has entered the Gulf of Mexico where conditions are favourable for strengthening. Certain models are calling for an increase in both strength and size. However, models are presently in agreement that some weakening will be seen as it approaches the Louisiana coastline.</p> <p>It is expected to curve to the north-east with a US landfall currently projected along the central Louisiana coastline. However, if the north-eastward curve is delayed, Houston and its surrounding areas could see an impact from this storm.</p>		

Possible Infrastructure Impact:

The current forecast track takes Delta into the heavy industrialized area of the Louisiana and possibly Texas regions, which includes assets in Oil Refining (including North America’s largest oil refinery), Petrochemical, LNG, Pipeline Transportation, Marine Terminals, Construction, Power Generation, Forestry and Logging.

Integra adjusters are currently working on several claims in this region, including some in the industries described above, and have existing knowledge of the industries, facilities, interconnectivity and impact of each in their respective markets.

Integra Response:

As Hurricane Delta makes its way towards Texas and Louisiana, we hope that those living and working in the path of the storm remain safe. Integra has successfully been handling claims arising from storms and hurricanes in the Gulf of Mexico for the last 22 years and has continually delivered settlements for the insureds, brokers, and insurers in faster time frames than our peers in that period.

Our Houston and Miami offices are monitoring events closely and are available to discuss typical loss mitigation measures, pertinent policy clauses and the milestones required to be reached to enable payments on account to be made on claims that might arise from this tropical storm.
